Any other comments on flood protection in Ashburton?

Tinwald ought to be classed as East and West. On the West side, Melcombe Street and the viaduct off SH1 are underwater after any significant rain event. We live in East Tinwald, behind Lushingtons Garden Centre and not far from the SH1 viaduct. Even during the major flood event of 2021 our surrounding East area remained no different to other significant rain events and we were not underwater. There seems to be more of an issue with stormwater drainage and flooding on the West side. I also believe we are on higher ground on the East side, as noticed at the houses closest to the river. The river posed no threat to the first houses off Carters Terrace as they are on a higher terrace, despite the river flowing through the lower lying paddocks on their land. Classing all of Tinwald as D and hiking us up +152% does not seem accurate or reasonable. Tinwald does have issues, but Allenton has been divided accordingly. Can East Tinwald therefore be classed as E, no different to Allenton South.
