Even though option 1 produces huge savings for many people and supports the most vulnerable in our community (great), the aim of this is possibly more to reduce carbon emissions / get more bums on seats in public transport, rather than just make it better for those already using it. There is a possibility that option 1 will also increase the existing stigma around public transport (through the bus becoming a desirable location for homeless/transient/vulnerable folk to be during the day esp in winter since it's free) and prevent high-emitters e.g. professionals/commuters from shifting their lifestyles to low-emission transport. We need a CULTURE SHIFT around public transport more than anything else e.g. increasing its desirability to the masses - especially for those who would not otherwise take it.

Changes to bus fares need to be accompanied with advertising/public awareness that targets high emitters and points out the benefits e.g. increased productivity by being able to work on the bus; opportunities for mindfulness on the bus; reduced hassle with parking; being able to drink after work; savings on car-use; exercise walking to and from the bus-stop.
