Introduction

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the *proposed options for Changing Public Transport Fare Structure*

By 2050 one in 4 people in Christchurch will be over 65. That is double the figure of today. More importantly, the over 80 population will increase by 280% and the over 95 population by 700%.

We must acknowledge this change in the demographic and explicitly plan for what our community will look like, paying particular attention to the older old population. Currently 50% of those over 95 live in the community (not in residential care)

General comments

Public transport is a critical resource for ensuring everyone, including older people, can stay connected to their community.

We support Environment Canterbury looking at ways to improve the service and increase the patronage.

However, any change to the system, fares, routes, timetables etc. need to have the 'how will this affect older people' lens cast across them.

Specific comments

It is good to see that none of the options proposed will affect Supergold card eligibility.

However, any increase in rates, to fund option 1 and 2 would have an impact on older people and their ability to afford to live.

Supergold card trips are already paid for from government funding, through taxes, by adding cost to the rates of people over 65, they will effectively be paying twice for the bus ride.
