Kia ora, my name is Chloe and I am 28 years of age, working at the University of Canterbury. I have lived in Ōtautahi Christchurch for 20 years. I wholeheartedly support Option One: making fares free for under 25s, students, total mobility and community services card holders. In Christchurch 53% of co2 comes from transport. An accessible, equitable, public transport system is vital if we are to meet our goal of becoming carbon net neutral by 2050. A major barrier for many people choosing public transport are the fares. For many people in Christchurch, it is currently cheaper to use a private vehicle than it is to use public transport - despite the ownership fees, the harmful emissions, and the stress involved in driving/congestion, parking etc etc. While the shift to Option One will not impact my personal public transport use (as I am not currently within the target groups identified and I am able to cycle 99% of the time) the impact that it will have on our climate and our communities is of immense importance to me. Together we can send a strong signal to Aotearoa that Ōtautahi is serious about lowering it's carbon emissions, and also caring for our vulnerable communities. The climate crisis is happening now, and now is the time to support people to make good, accessible, equitable transport choices.
