Hard to put priorities on this without discussion with a range of people and suspect my top of the head ideas might not be that useful. I tend towards wanting to kill several birds with one stone - eg wetland restoration can be good for both managing flooding and droughts as well as being good for biodiversity and water quality. Electrification of the PT fleet and perhaps an extension of what is seen as PT - eg not just buses but could include other transport forms e.g., electric car and bike hire. Not that the RC needs to fund these necessarily but they could have a role in encouraging them or thinking about their use in relation to Buses etc.

Any other comments on future funding for responding to climate change?

I imagine there will be more national level discussion of this as the Government works through the climate change adaptation legislation that is being developed and would think that suggestions might be more useful after than comes out.

Any other comments on Environment Canterbury's draft Annual Plan or other matters?

I like what I see, on the whole. I am uncertain about what is included in monitoring water quality but in light of the PCE's March report "Knowing what is out there" (https://www.pce.parliament.nz/our-work/news-insights/media-release-regulating-the-environmental-fate-of-chemicals), I'd like to see some monitoring of the use of agricultural and, industrial chemicals and ensuring that we know what is and isn't being used adequately and what sorts of chemicals contaminants might be reaching our waterways.
