#### 5.3 TE REO WORDS – WITH MICHAEL MCMILLAN

This month we have a popular whakataukī:

Hutia te rito o te harakeke, kei hea te kōmako e ko? ki mau ki ahau, he aha te mea nui o te ao? Māku e ki atu, he tangata, he tangata.

If you pluck out the heart of the flax bush how can the bell bird sing? You ask me, what is the greatest reality of the universe? the people, the people.

Jakki Guilford commented on the whakataukī being descriptive and Michael explained about the knowledge of how a flax bush grows (children on the outside and the inner part being the older generation) and when flax is harvested the outer leaves only are removed as if the inner leaves are taken the flax dies.

#### 5.4 CHAIR'S UPDATE

#### RECOMMENDATION

That the Chair's Update be accepted.

- The Chair mentioned the passing of Peter Ramsden, who had a strong association with CWMS Zone Committees, including the Lower Waitaki Zone Committee, Tom Hurst's passing (father of Colin Hurst). A card will be prepared and sent on behalf of the Zone Committee to both families.
- Chris Batstone has tendered his resignation from the Lower Waitaki Zone Committee, as he has resigned from the Waihao Wainono Catchment Board. Chris has indicated he is happy to provide technical knowledge to the Committee in the future, if needed.
- The field trip at Hakataramea on 8 December was enjoyed by all who attended thanks to Sarah and Laura for hosting the Committee.
- Northern Fan Catchment Group: Kennedy advised that Tom Byrne, Land Management Advisor has tendered his resignation from ECan. This is a great loss to this project. Dairy NZ is working in the catchment calculating data and hopes to attract MPI and Jobs for Nature funding. Kennedy to work towards collaboration with Dairy NZ where appropriate.
- MGI's Greenhouse Gas Workshop planning underway directors to meet 3 March then MGI will look at expanding to wider community
- Meeting with Know your Catchment (Fraser McKenzie): WIC has been handed programme by Irrigation NZ (INZ) and is working with IRIS (data science) to provide quote to make programme more user friendly.

#### 5.5 COUNCILLORS' UPDATE

#### Cr Nicole Marshall

- Ngai Tahu Representation Bill is with Maori Affairs Select Committee stage. Proposed hearings 1-7 March (ChCh)
- Contestable Fund applications: The only allocation in Lower Waitaki Zone was to Sustainable South Canterbury Trust: \$10k to Eco Centre Launch and Progression
- CWMS regional committee: Jane Demeter is the new co-chair (Ngai Tahu appointment still to be made). The most southern appointment is Angela Cushnie from the Ashburton Zone Committee. No applications from South Canterbury
  - Next week's Council meeting voting on approval of the draft Annual Plan for consultation
    - a. Changes to rates signalled in the LTP
    - b. Sample properties to show rates change
    - c. Consultation/submission opens 2 March

#### Cr Fabia Fox

- First Council Meeting held 16 February
- Busy working on Sea Week
- Soon to begin Annual Plan deliberations, don't believe there will be consultation, but there will be engagement and community communications.
- Exciting that shared position (with ECan) of climate change/biodiversity is underway

#### LOWER WAITAKI SOUTH COASTAL CANTERBURY ZONE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

• Cr Fabia Fox commented on Waimate's involvement in the Communities 4 Local Democracy (C4LD) combined councils campaign, being an alternative option to Government Three Waters delivery proposal

#### Cr Jim Hopkins

- First meeting for year on 11 January with local farmers over District Plan
- Expect Three Waters Reform to feature prominently in Annual Plan, however anxieties with expected loss of localism
- Ahuriri Councillor (and member of Upper Waitaki Zone Committee) Ross McRobie passed away, with elections within a year, Council decided not to appoint a replacement.
- No formal discussion as a council on the Three Waters delivery proposal. Cr Hopkins keen to add his name to the campaign on an individual basis.

#### 5.6 ZONE COMMITTEE UPDATE

Extension of Zone Committee's Community Members: The Committee discussed and agreed to the continuation of the Chair and Deputy Chair's role until the next refresh.

Sara Elliot and Laura Johnston spoke on the proposal and the report in the agenda:

- Experts with technical knowledge are on board (including Jonnie Rutherford) to assist with propagating native plantings.
- Meetings and nursery visits are planned to ensure the proposal will be successful. Once the initial process gets underway, more assistance can be tapped into.
- John Benn advised DoC has a specialist native nursey at Banks Peninsula which could be contacted to assist with any advice.
- Fraser McKenzie advised Moeraki Rununga are involved in native propagation who would be happy to be approached
- Jakki Guilford suggested the Collective approach COGs for outside funding
- Michael Mcmillan noted Manawhenua need to be involved.

- Upcoming planting day at Black Hole planned for late April/early May.
- The group wish to retain separate identify from ECan but require support by way of information and assistance
- Good to see new members, there is good community support for the group
- It is vital the group has resourcing by way of paid administration support. It is difficult for people in voluntary positions to provide professional support for catchment groups.
- Chris Batstone's work has been invaluable.
- The Lower Waitaki Committee agreed, in principal, to consider earmarking funding for a facilitator/administrator for the Waihao Wainono Catchment Group.

#### 5.9 URBAN STORMWATER CAMPAIGN/SEA WEEK UPDATE – CR FABIA FOX

- Cr Fabia Fox asked for approval for the \$5,000 funding for the proposal as presented in the agenda.
- Jonnie Rutherford commented location and safety issues need to be considered around the Waihao Box structure
- Zone Committee Members are encouraged to be involved in the beach clean-up on 12 March.
- Communications to be channelled through Waimate, Waitaki and Environment Canterbury
- Waitaki District Council may possibly look at another spring stormwater/sea week event.

- The Chair offered to assist with first few meetings as a farmer, encouraged Kennedy to take advance of the enthusiasm amongst farmers.
- The Lower Waitaki Zone Committee recommended funding be allocated to the Northern Fan Water Quality Project from the Action Plan Budget after receiving further communication.

#### 5.11 KNOW YOUR CATCHMENT PLATFORM UPDATE – JEN FELLOWS

- Waitaki Irrigators Collective (WIC) are funding the programme update of \$5,500 to get the programme useable.
- Seeking quote from IRIS (Software Company) to make the programme more user friendly
- The Committee agreed this is an important tool with exciting outcomes to provide science into water quality
- The Lower Waitaki Zone Committee recommended funding to be allocated to the Know Your Catchment Project from the Action Plan Budget of up to \$6,000.

#### Lower Waitaki South Coastal Canterbury Water Zone Committee

#### Declaration of Interests Register - Amended 16.02.22

Keeping a Zone Committee Members' declarations of interest register allows Zone Committees to identify and manage a conflict of interest when it arises. The Office of the Auditor General notes a conflict of interest can arise when: "A members or officials duties or responsibilities to a public entity could be affected by some other interest or duty that the member or official may have."<sup>1</sup> If a member is in any doubt as to whether or not they have a conflict of interest, then the Member should seek guidance from Catherine Schache (General Counsel, Environment Canterbury), the Zone Facilitator and/or refer to the following guidance: <a href="https://www.oag.govt.nz/2010/lamia">https://www.oag.govt.nz/2010/lamia</a>

Types of Interest to be documented in the register:

- · Employment, trade or profession carried on by the Member or the Member's spouse for profit or gain
- Company, trust, partnership etc for which the Member or their spouse is a director, partner or trustee, or a shareholder of more than 10% shares
- Address of any land in which the Member has a beneficial interest and which is in the area of the Zone Committee
- The address of any land where the landlord is Environment Canterbury, Waimate District Council or Waitaki District Council and the Member or their spouse is a tenant; or

the land is tenanted by a firm in which the Member or spouse is a partner, a company of which the Member or spouse is a director, or a Trust of which the Member or spouse is a Trustee.

- Any other matters which the public might reasonably regard as likely to influence the Member's actions during the course of their duties as a Member.
- Any contracts held between the Member or the Member's spouse and Environment Canterbury, Waimate District Council or Waitaki
  District Council, including contracts in which the Member or their spouse is a partner, a company of which the spouse is a director
  and/or holds more than 10% in shares, or a Trust of which the Member or their spouse is a trustee (noting that no committee member
  should be a party to a contract with Environment Canterbury or Waimate or Waitaki District Council if that value is more than \$25,000
  per annum)

- 3. Grant agreements have been signed and invoices received for payment for both the Waitaki Valley Biodiversity Education and the Know Your Catchment projects.
- 4. At the 16 February meeting the Zone Committee recommended funding to the value of \$38,500, leaving \$11,500 yet to be allocated.
- 5. The Urban Stormwater project will be underspent by approximately \$2,400 due to COVID-19 limiting community and school engagement. This increases the **available funds for allocation to \$13,900**.
- 6. The Northern Fan project farmer engagement has been delayed due to Environment Canterbury staff availability. However, the grant could still contribute to the purchase of a turbidity monitor for the project.

#### Further funding options

7. With two months until the end of financial year it is desirable to decide on allocation of the remaining \$13,900. Waihao Wainono Catchment Community Group would be able to put the remaining funds to good use and their Chair, Roger Small, will discuss this with the committee during the meeting.

#### **CWMS Zone Committee Refresh 2022**

- 2. The dates for the CWMS Zone Committee Refresh for 2022 have now been arranged.
  - Expressions of interest for all Zone Committees will be open from Friday 29 April and close on Monday 23 May.
  - Promotion of this year's CWMS Refresh will be conducted between 4 and 28 April.
  - The Selection Workshops will be held in June, with the Selection Panel recommendations of refresh appointments being presented to Councils for approval in July and August.
