	Gina Slee gave brief run through of local update from report		
	 Control work to happen soon for Yellow Water Lily 		
	 Search and control work on African Love Grass around Omarama happened before Christmas and in the last week 		
	 Concentrating on rabbit inspections at the moment in rabbit prone areas, and re-inspections of properties under Notice. 		
	 Darwin's barberry programme happening in partnership with community groups, have also engaged contractors. 		
	Significant find of Nassella tussock in the southern region, Laurence Smith presented photos/videos to the group of the find.		
	Questions around how the nassella tussock find was missed for 30 years? Many reasons – e.g. budget under the previous pest management plan for surveillance was very small, and lack of awareness from the community. Spread from		

machinery, vehicles, stock (particularly sheep) is an issue with moving nassella/grass weeds

Discussion around pest pathway management with contractors, e.g. Kiwi Rail/NZTA – looking at ramping up programme. Katie Evans from MPI is interested to come meet with this group about pest pathway management in the future.

4.4	Biosecurity Advisor - Invasive Organisms	Morgan Shields	
	Morgan Shields introduced himself to the group and discussed the future focus of his role as ECan's Biosecurity Advisor for Invasive Organisms.		
	Currently collating a list of species that we need to investigate and prioritise. Mostly plants, things that aren't in Canterbury yet but could get here. Large scope. Contacting community groups/industry/Crown research institutes/universities – open to receiving information from all sources. Looking into distribution of pests etc. Once we have the list, will be able to prioritise species and increase our surveillance programme.		
	Will be looking at increasing surveillance around places undertaking plant sales, including online, roadside stalls etc.		
	Request to receive regular updates from Morgan at meetings		
	Technical Advisory Group (TAG) pretty much there with terms of reference etc, will be an external group looking at practical/scientific methods around invasive organisms.		Morgan to provide regular updates at meetings.
4.5	BAG Chair Election and future membership	Laurence

	Ines Stager talked to the group about looking for an overall strategy for weed control for the entire region, and then breaking that off into subsets, possibly getting together an inventory of what's out there. Looking to try and find a way to	Stager	

	effectively deal with pests collectively, rather than small, isolated areas committing lots of resources. The idea would be to create collective priorities and shared understanding between key agencies and the community to prevent incursions of aggressive species. Laurence Smith referred back to gap between biosecurity/biodiversity that is highlighted in the Parliamentary Commissioners report. Key is to pick the battles, of all the things that are out there, what are the impacts on the high value sites and how do we help those people fight the pests, not on Crown land – Crown need to control their own land. 4.7	General Business Gavin Loxton gave update on biocontrol efforts. Horehound Clearwing Moth - has collected all funding and got started collecting the larvae but then came to a halt. Hard to distinguish the difference between the clearwing larvae and the beetle larvae. Potentially misread how big the clearwing population is, have confirmed with DNA that it does exist, just not sure how big the population is and how quickly it is spreading itself. Have gone back to the catchment group who provided the funding and asked to distribute the plume moth instead in Spring, which will be cheaper than the Clearwing moth, however clearwing would provide a better level of control.
