	Regional report update that was sent out taken as read.		
	Laurence briefly highlighted some regionally focussed items from the update provided.		
	Touched on Velvet Leaf – time of year to be on lookout for it.		
	Biosecurity Act Review update – nothing to update, still waiting for the update to go across the Minister's desk, then needs to go out for public review		
	Feral animals/ungulates – have had a meeting, was quite productive. Good to talk to that group of people, get a feeling where everyone sits. Established communication and will be an ongoing discussion. Department of Conservation are currently working on a strategy, will be out in the near future. Will be good to see what they're proposing. Main thing was to hear from LINZ and DOC at that meeting, will be further meetings with wider groups of people.		
	Question – who was at that meeting?		
	Initially was going to be a meeting with DOC & LINZ only, but did invite NZ Game Council & Deer Stalkers Assn. Fed Farmers asked to be included from hearing about it at a BAG meeting. Key thing was to learn more about the strategy being developed at a higher level particularly to do with LINZ & DOC – LINZ made some comments but DOC is the main player. Looking at having further meetings with a broader range of groups.

	Question from the update regarding the large Nassella tussock find in Southern area, why wasn't it found earlier?  Many reasons e.g. budget under the previous pest management plan for surveillance was very small, coupled with lack of awareness from the community and focus on the known infested areas predominantly in North Canterbury.		ungulates meeting

4.2	Developing a strategy for weed management	Nicky Snoyink	
	Nicky Snoyink discussed developing a strategy for weed management in Canterbury.		
	Comes out of discussion with Upper Waimakariri Basin Weed Group, they have funding to deal with weeds that impact our native eco system. There was a meeting at ECan a year or so ago with all the players in the upper Waimakariri to kickstart the process. Where it's at currently is Boffa Miskell is undertaking a survey of the weeds in the upper Waimakariri catchment, and a strategy will be formed. Question is what is the pathway to get the strategy up and running, who funds it etc?		
	Timing of Space Invaders report – highlighted not a lot of coordination/alignment with biosecurity/biodiversity.		
	Trying to foster better relationship between regional biodiversity team and biosecurity teams. Discussion around strategies of biosecurity and biodiversity and how groups can navigate getting support from ECan.	Laurence Smith

	Presentation from Greg Stanley, Regional Biodiversity Officer from Environment Canterbury on his project, the Climate Resilience Programme (Part of Covid-19 Recovery Fund, Shovel Ready).	Stanley	Greg's presentation to be forwarded to group.
4.4	Biosecurity Advisor – Invasive Organisms	Morgan	
	Morgan Shields introduced himself to the group and discussed the future focus of his role as ECan's Biosecurity Advisor for Invasive Organisms. Looking to be more proactive with Biosecurity approaches.	Shields	
	Currently collating a list of species that we need to investigate and prioritise. Looking at emerging pests and weeds, things that aren't in Canterbury yet but could get here from other		

parts of the country. Considering climate change as well. Long term approach. Focusing on pests, weeds, insects, etc. Trying to prevent the next big pest getting out of control.

Morgan currently contacting community groups/industry/Crown research institutes/universities – open to receiving information from all sources. Researching distribution of pests etc. Once we have the list, will be able to prioritise species and increase our surveillance programme. Very broad approach initially, then will narrow down. List is currently 470 species.

People are encouraged to use Find-A-Pest – great to have digital report.

Will be getting advice from Technical Advisory Group (TAG) as well, pretty much there with terms of reference etc, will be an external group looking at practical/scientific methods around invasive organisms.

Aim is to be more informed and make better decisions in the future and contain/exclude some very problematic species that could cost us in the future.

Work will feed into the surveillance programme and inform pathway management.
