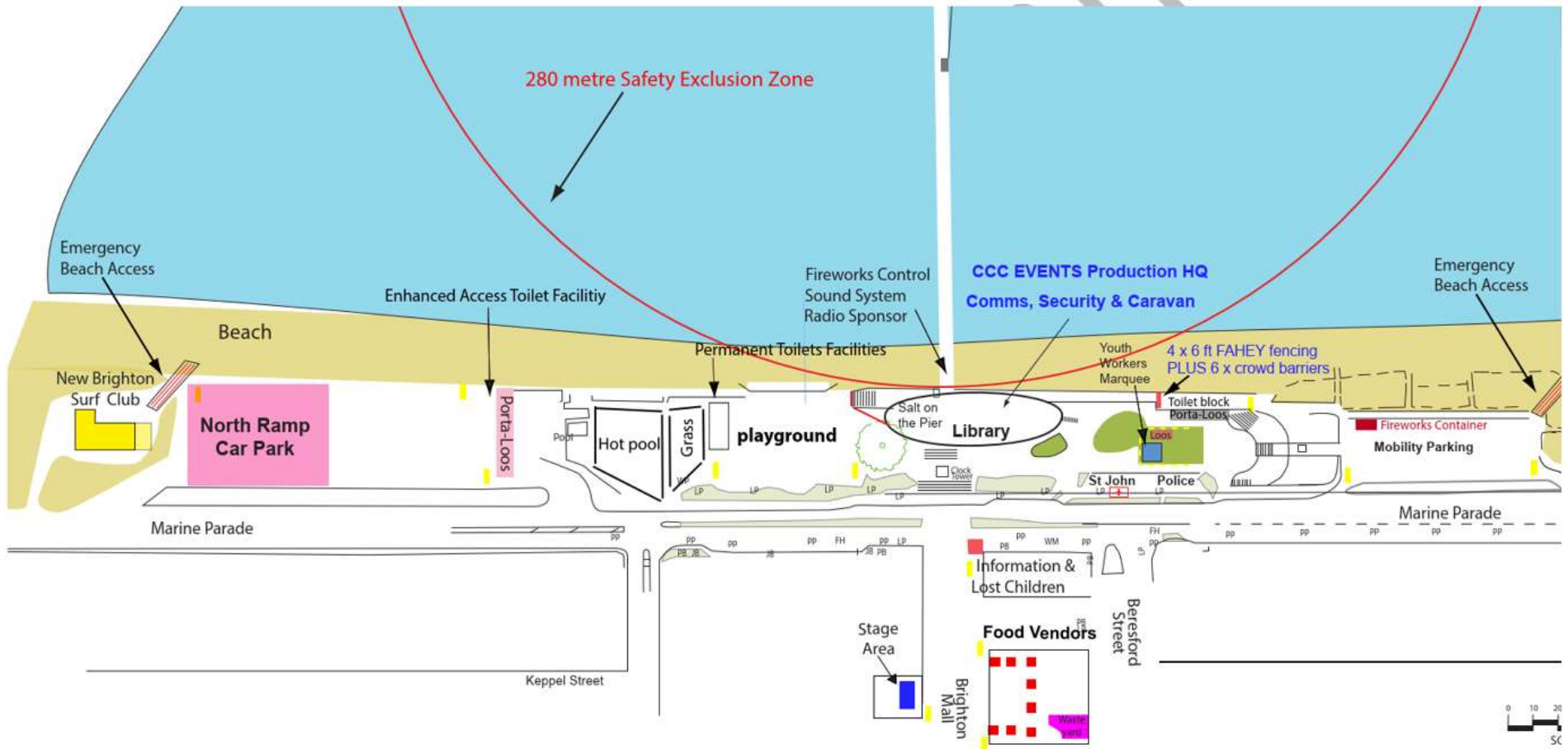


Temporary Reservation Certificate, issued pursuant to:
Canterbury Regional Council Navigation Safety Bylaw 2016
Clauses 12 and 32.



Name of holder: Christchurch City Council
Period: From: 1700 to 2100 on Sat 9 th July 2022 or 1700 to 2100 Sunday 10 th July (alternate day for weather); or Until revoked by the Harbourmaster.
Reserved Area: Exclusion Zone, area from New Brighton Pier centre out to a circle radius 280m
Map attached: Yes/No
Purpose: Exclusion of all unauthorized vessels within safety zone of 280m from New Brighton Pier to allow safe operation of Matariki Fireworks Display. Uplift of 5 knot rule within 200m of shore or structure for the purpose of enforcement of exclusion zone, or in case of emergency.
Reservation: No vessel shall navigate within the Reserved Area as listed above except with the express permission of, and in a manner explicitly approved by, the certificate holder or his delegate.
Conditions:
Publication of notice of Reservation: Public notification of exclusion zone as per CCC fireworks plan.
Notice of Reservation to be: Displayed on: All support vessels Displayed by: Andrew Bakker (or delegate). Removed by: Andrew Bakker (or delegate); or the Harbourmaster
A copy of the Temporary Reservation Certificate to be carried by: Andrew Bakker and all support vessel skippers
Safety conditions: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Formal safety briefing to be given to safety boat skippers prior to event.2. Safety plan supplied for event to be adhered to.3. All breaches by support vessels of Maritime Rule Part 91 or Navigation Safety Bylaw 2016 (such as 5 knot rule) to be logged and reported to the Harbourmaster at the conclusion of the event.
Temporary Reservation shall not take effect if: Conditions above are not met.
