9.1 Canterbury Water Management Strategy Action Plan Budget

Recommendation

- 1. That the OTOP Zone Committee recommends to Environment Canterbury that The Burkes Pass Heritage Trust receive \$8,000 from the CWMS Action Plan Budget.
- 2. That the OTOP Zone Committee recommends to Environment Canterbury that the Men's Shed Trust Geraldine receive \$7,656 from the CWMS Action Plan Budget.
- 3. That the OTOP Zone Committee recommends to Environment Canterbury that the budget alterations noted in the OTOP CWMS Action Plan Budget _updated April 22 are accepted.

Purpose of Report

1 This report is by Janine Roux, Zone Facilitator and follows on from Zone Committee workshops held in November 2021 and April 2022. It provides updated recommendations on the allocation of the CWMS Action Plan Budget for the 2021/2022 financial year. This report outlines projects to the sum of \$44,156.

Discussion

- 2 The CWMS Action Plan Budget was launched in 2021 with the purpose of the funding to allow Zone Committees to focus on implementing their action plan and leverage other funding opportunities to achieve the CWMS priorities.
- 3 Each of the ten water zones in Canterbury has \$50,000 to recommend on projects that relate to their Zone Committee Action Plan 2021 - 2024. The budget is administered, allocated, and monitored by Environment Canterbury.

Purpose of Report

1 This report is from Janine Roux, Zone Facilitator, Environment Canterbury. It provides information that may be of interest to the Zone Committee that is not covered elsewhere in the agenda.

Discussion

Cyanobacteria

2 Nothing to report for this period.

Well Water Checks

- 3 The OTOP Water Zone Committee has included an action to hold a targeted event to promote well water testing in its 2021-24 Action Plan.
- 4 The first drinking water testing day is confirmed for Monday 16 May 2022. This date also allows for the Zone Committee to engage with the community prior to the member fresh refresh applications closing.
- 5 Purpose: To raise awareness in the OTOP Zone about private drinking water supplies quality and risk. To provide information about well water quality results and what to do about them. To encourage uptake of well water testing.
- 6 Problem/challenge: Individual households on private water supplies must arrange and pay for their own well water tests. However, community members have told the zone committee that the importance of testing is not well known or understood.
- 7 Previous work: The Selwyn Waihora Zone Committee held a similar event in 2021. This means some of the material is prepared. The aim is to be able to continue sharing material and feedback with other Water Zone Committees in the future.
- 8 Measuring success: The number of people who attend testing opportunities as well as improved awareness of where and how to test private water supply. Feedback from those who attend testing sessions
- 9 Session times are as follows:
 - i. Morning session to be held in Temuka Alpine Energy Meeting Room at 10am 12.30pm.

ii. The afternoon session will be in Fairlie from 3pm – 5.30pm.

Tiriti o Waitangi Training

- 10 The OTOP Water Zone Committee has included in its 2021-24 Action Plan an action to host an annual te tiriti o Waitangi workshop for community members to attend.
- 11 Purpose: Showing a commitment to raising awareness of how to engage in a more positive manner with Runanga.
- 12 Measuring success: Ensuring the maximum number of people attend the offered training session. Feedback from those who attend the session.
- 13 Two-day training session confirmed for $13^{th} 14^{th}$ June 2022. This is open to any catchment group members and Catchment Collective South Canterbury members.
