1. Detail Te Whakamahuki

1. Purpose of Briefing	To gain a greater understanding of the Re-Wild Wainu catchment group. To agree on 3-5 key priorities that will form the basis of early input to the Long Term Plans of councils, if the Committee wishes to provide input.
	Catchment groups – reWild Wainui
	The time allocated for this topic is approximately 25 minutes (15 min presentation, 10 min discussion).
	Lawrence Smith is the Project Lead for reWild Wainui
	The idea of reWild Wainui was seeded at a monthly Wainui Residents Association meeting in 2020. This is a catchment group that is focusing on biodiversity.
2.	For further information, visit the group's website or social media sites www.rewildwainui.nz and ReWild Wainui Facebook
	From a Zone Committee perspective, improving ecosystem health and biodiversity is part of facilitating enduring land and water management solutions.
	reWild Wainui may apply to the CWMS Action Plan Budget. Lawrence is not able to present in October, so he is presenting in September. The Committee has also been planning to invite this group to give a presentation for some time, ideally in Wainui. However, the Committee will not be visiting Wainui this year, so the group has been invited to do this in Lyttelton.
	Eliza Knight also has a connection with this group, through her involvement with the Wainui community.
	Early Long Term Plan input to Councils
3.	If the Committee chooses to do so, it can provide early input to the Long Term Plans of Christchurch City Council and Environment Canterbury that are currently in the early stages of development. This can be in the form of a letter.
	It is recommended that early input by Zone Committees:
	Focuses on 3-5 priorities
	That these are prioritised in order of importance
