REPORTS

1. Greendale Primary Enviroschools Update and Request

Bronwyn Harding presented to the Committee (Refer to the presentation for details).

She said the Near River Recharge site is their outdoor classroom encouraging experiential learning. They wanted to return to a holistic approach to learning, with students exploring and engaging, collecting data, solving problems and keen to participate. There was also a solid cultural narrative built into the curriculum.

Ms Harding told the Committee that they had experienced challenges over the past couple of years, including COVID, bus transport and securing parent transport – people were busy and did not have the time to accompany the kids on the site visits.

Ms Harding presented their request for funding for bus transport. The Chair thanked her for the presentation and said he had been out to the site and could see the children really enjoyed being there.

In response to a question from Councillor Southworth about the age difference of kids and how this was managed, Ms Harding said they try and mix up the activities. She added the older children use the proper language which meant the smaller kids learn from them.

It was noted the application and original recommendation was for \$2,500.00 but they were actually only asking for \$830 to cover this year's transport costs.

2. Central Plains Water Limited

Central Plains Water Limited (CPWL) Chief Executive, Susan Goodfellow presented to the zone committee. (Refer to presentation for details). Ms Goodfellow told the Committee about the structure of CPWL as well as the Trust and its importance. She said while CPWL apply for consents, the Trust holds it and is responsible for it. Ms Goodfellow said CPWL has a Board and Directors and their business model was one of cost recovery, and not profit. She said they recently worked on creating a 100-year plan with intergenerational outcomes.

CPWL was weather and season dependent and there have been dry periods over the past years. She told the Committee about some of the performance indicators and achievements in the past couple of years and noted the new generation of farm environment plans being introduced.

Ms Goodfellow invited the Committee to contact her should they wish to do a bus trip to CPWL sites.
