8.2 State Highway Designations Review - Issues and Options

Staff provided the Committee with an overview of key issues and options related to a review of state highway designations across Canterbury. This was in response to the matter of urgent business raised by Mayor Broughton at the Committee meeting on 1 June 2023.

- 3. Agrees to proceed with either:
 - 3.1. Option 1 Do not request that Waka Kotahi undertake a review of the state highway designations in Canterbury.
 - 3.2. Option 2 Request that Waka Kotahi undertake a review of the state highway designations in Canterbury.
 - 3.3. Option 3 Request that Waka Kotahi progress the review of the state highway policy and the state highway evaluation criteria as a priority. LAPSED

8.3 Canterbury Regional Land Transport Plan Review -Regional Programme of Activities

Refer to pages 40 to 68 of the agenda.

Staff sought the Committee's approval of the ten-year transport investment priority weightings, the ranked regionally significant improvement activities, and the proposed approach to the regional programme section of the Draft Canterbury Regional Land Transport Plan 2024-34. A presentation was given for this item and is attached to the minutes as attachment 8.3.1.

Secretarial note: The Committee requested that the following feedback be incorporated into the draft Regional Land Transport Plan 2024-34 and any future plans:

- The item 'Ashburton Bridge State Highway 1' needs to be referred to as 'Ashburton Tinwald Connectivity,' in line with the information Waka Kotahi already has on this project.
- The request by the Mackenzie District Council to include a footbridge/cycleway across the Opihi River in the plan.
- Our processes could be better aligned with Waka Kotahi's processes to ensure consistency across projects and plans to reduce the risk of projects being unfunded and promote better partnership between councils and Waka Kotahi.
- In future, Mayors would like further understanding of the regional transport context to view the plan with a region-wide lens and inform their decisions on the plan, given that their familiarity lies mostly with their own projects.
- The narrative and wording of the plan should reflect the priority of finishing current work, including New Zealand Upgrade Programme projects, before embarking on new projects. It should also include some context about the outcomes of previous or current projects to ensure accountability.
- Canterbury's projects must be driven by Canterbury at a local level and communicated to central government and political parties to ensure that potential future projects are delivered in line with Canterbury's priorities.
- The full life cost of projects must be taken into account, ensuring that maintenance costs aren't ignored and that there is more visibility on the impact of projects on future councils.

Resolved CRTC/2023/29

Updated staff recommendations.

That the Canterbury Regional Transport Committee:

- 1. Approves the weightings of the ten-year transport investment priorities for the Draft Canterbury Regional Land Transport Plan 2024-34, as follows:
 - 1.1. Create a well-maintained network (highest priority)
 - 1.2. Manage risk of exposure to extreme events (35%)
 - 1.3. Support and develop connected public transport and active transport networks (30%)
 - 1.4. Implementing safer systems (Road 2 Zero) (25%)
 - Support and develop freight systems connecting to air, rail, and sea (10%)
- Notes that the ranked regionally significant improvement activities for the Draft Canterbury Regional Land Transport Plan 2024-34 (included as Attachment 8.3.1) is based on the weightings of the ten-year transport investment priorities and an evaluation of the impact and deliverability of the activities.
- 3. Approves the ranked regionally significant improvement activities (included as Attachment 8.3.1) for inclusion in the regional programme section of the Draft Canterbury Regional Land Transport Plan 2024-34, subject to the Christchurch Northern Link (including Woodend Bypass) being listed as the 3rd ranked activity to reflect its inclusion in the Draft Government Policy Statement on Land Transport 2024 as a project of strategic importance to the development of New Zealand's transport system.
- 4. Approves the proposed approach to the regional programme section of the Draft Canterbury Regional Land Transport Plan 2024-34, which includes identifying a longer-list of activities that could be delivered within the ten-year period should funding become available.
