To deliver this vision we have revised the objectives that guide our investment priorities (see page 28):

1. **Maintenance:** Strengthen the maintenance of the current network, so the network continues to underpin the transport outcomes across the region
2. **Resilience:** Develop a resilient transport network that can better cope with unknown stresses, natural disasters and climate change impacts
3. **Emissions:** Develop a range of transport emission reduction solutions across Canterbury to reduce negative environmental and health impacts
4. **Growth:** Develop the transport network to support well-planned, quality urban environments in areas of high growth
5. **Safety:** Reduce harm on our roads
6. **Freight:** Transition to a low emission freight system that more resilient, productive and innovative

Headline targets

We have proposed amendments to the headline targets for road safety, transport emissions and rail freight in the draft Canterbury Regional Land Transport Plan 2024–34 (see page 28). Please record any feedback you have on these targets, or any actions that you think will help us achieve them below (**amendments are bolded**):

Target 1: 40% reduction in deaths and serious injuries on Canterbury roads **by 2030**

Target 2: **41% reduction** in greenhouse gas emissions from land transport in Canterbury **by 2035**

Target 3: 100% increase in tonnage of freight moved by rail in Canterbury **by 2034**
